Site


The site comprises nearly the entire block formed by Yonge Street, Eglinton Avenue West, Duplex Avenue and Orchard View Boulevard and has an area of approximately1.95 hectares (4.82 acres). The site contains the Yonge-Eglinton Centre, a mixed use development including two office towers of 30 and 22 storeys in height, two residential rental apartment buildings of 22 and 17 storeys and a multi-storey underground retail concourse. On the southeast corner of the site is a publicly accessible pedestrian square from which the office towers and retail component of the development can be accessed as well as an underground concourse leading to the Eglinton Subway Station.

Proposal

The application proposes to amend the Zoning By-law to permit the construction of five and seven storey additions on top of the two existing office towers and a three storey addition to the retail concourse at grade. The requested increase in gross floor area would result in a density over the entirety of the subject lands of approximately 8.7 times the area of the lot.

Purpose of the Meeting
