
Capitol Theatre façade, vestibule and theatre volume, as well as the existing canopy structure, are proposed to be incorporated into the development. A total of 184 vehicular and 184 bicycle parking spaces are proposed, that would be accessed from a driveway off of Castlefield Avenue.
